New Developments Feature Town Centers and Green Space

Georgetown's growing population in has resulted in an unprecedented level of new construction. In 2007, new developments were announced in all sectors of town. This issue of the Georgetown City Reporter profiles some of the larger new housing developments and commercial projects that have been announced or are in the early stages of construction.

Some of the planned housing developments will feature nature preserves, parkland, and walking trails. A number of these developments also will include town centers with neighborhood shops

and village greens. These traditional neighborhood designs with big front porches and shared open space seek to create places where residents can easily congregate and socialize.

While projections can change, the developments below represent 13,782 housing units for an estimated 31,700 new residents at full build-out. The projects will be built in phases over a number of years. City planners estimate that Georgetown's population in November was 46,812, and by 2015 is projected to exceed




Residential and commercial project in east 400 block on S. Austin Avenue
